Order of Adjectives

- **★ Opinion** adjectives (*beautiful*, *interesting*, *etc.*) go before **fact** adjectives (*dark*, *ancient*, *wooden*, *etc.*). This is an **eye-catching marble** sculpture.
- ★ When there are two or more adjectives of the same category, the more general adjective goes before the more specific one, e.g, an attractive, thought-provoking painting.
- ★ When there are two or more fact adjectives in a sentence they normally go in the following order:

★ Nouns which express purpose, material or substance (work, bronze, gold, etc.) can be used as adjectives before the nouns, e. g.: This is a decorative porcelain cup.
